Rehearsal reminders

Tomorrow night is the final Tuesday rehearsal of the Christmas music, led by Darius, with Rachel on the piano. Note that in 100 Carols for Choirs the First Noel is page 323 and Jesus Child is page 110. The rehearsal will end at 9.15pm.

Arrangements for Christmas carol concerts on Saturday 16 December (attachment)

- Rehearsal. There will be a compulsory 2-hour rehearsal at 12 noon on the afternoon of the concert. Please sign in using the electronic system we use at rehearsal this will be situated on the production corridor. Please be in your places ready to sing by 12 noon; seating plan attached.
- MAR Darius is of the firm opinion that, because of the short rehearsal schedule for the
 Christmas concerts, two rehearsals (ie 50%) is simply not enough rehearsal time and he is
 not prepared to give special approval to members whose MAR is 50%. If anyone has the
 slightest concern about their attendance record they should contact John Spence
 at membership@sheffieldphil.org.
- **Dressing rooms**. As in previous years there is an event in the ballroom so we cannot have the basement dressing rooms. Space will therefore be extremely limited and members are advised to arrive at the City Hall either fully or partly changed into concert dress. Ladies will be in the Vincent Harris room (hanging rails, mirrors, water), with a bit more space in Dressing Room 3, while gents will share the Barbirolli room (hanging rails, mirrors, water). Members who have difficulty with stairs may use Dressing Room 1.
- **Meals**. Those who take packed teas can eat in the dressing room or nearby corridors, or in the auditorium, as long as they clear up after themselves which of course people always do!
- Concert Dress: Remember that for this concert, gentlemen generally wear brightly
 coloured bow ties, while ladies may wear Christmas earrings and/or brooches etc, turning
 on those which have flashing lights <u>after</u> the interval. Please note that these are the only
 permissible variations from the SPC Dress Code, which you will find on our website and on
 the notice board.
- Going on stage: Please line up ready to go onto the platform 15 minutes before the start time. Please try your best to line up on just one side of the stairway, leaving a clear path for orchestra colleagues to pass along with their instruments. There will be a steward at the platform entrance to help us file on, but also try to keep an eye on how colleagues are filing on the opposite side, so we can keep things even. Remember that folders are carried onto the platform under the outward facing arm (right arm stage right, left arm stage left), and that you should not take bottles of water on stage or wave at the audience. Please follow our Concert procedure; details on our website.
- **Folders**: If you're struggling to fit the music under the rather tight cords in your black folder, wind some black hat elastic several times round the spine of the folder. This makes it easier to organise the various bits of music without damage. It is available from any haberdashery department eg John Lewis. It doesn't show on stage.
- Sherry and mince pies will be served in the production corridor during the evening interval. It will be very crowded so please (a) don't queue at the table end, move down to collect sherry and mince pies from along the length of the table, and (b) move away from the table once you have collected your sherry and mince pie. Helen's helpers will be

outside the upper seating area at rehearsal tomorrow evening, to collect your donation and to sell raffle tickets; the lucky winner will receive a beautifully iced Christmas cake made by Janet Bower. Helen would greatly appreciate help with setting up and clearing away - please sign up so that she knows who to expect.

- **Programmes**: You will need to go round to the front of the City Hall to purchase your programme as the City Hall staff are unfortunately not able to sell them back stage.
- Stage decorations: Soprano Ann Garbett, who always does a marvellous job decorating the stage for the concerts, would appreciate a few volunteers to help dismantle it all afterwards. This has to be a rapid process as the crew start to pull everything down the second we leave the stage! Volunteers to Ann Garbett or Anne Adams please. Thank you.
- Parking: Chorus members are able to get a car parking voucher from the City Hall Box Office, enabling them to pay just £3.50 for the full day in the Q Park on Rockingham Street. Park your car, go to the box office and get the voucher, which you'll need when you pay. Please note the voucher is only valid at the Rockingham Street car park.

He would very much like to come to the afternoon performance of the Christmas Concert. This year's membership cards are now available and Finance Officer Graham Dawson is happy to accept subscription forms and fees. To keep everything legal and our information up-to-date, all members are asked to complete a new subscription form which is attached even if you have a continuing standing order or have already paid. Hard copies are also available from Graham if you don't want to print your own.

Please complete the form accurately as it is used for gift aid purposes and we do encourage all UK taxpayers to gift aid their subscriptions if they can. This brings in 25p for every £1 paid in subscription. Please use the name and address that you are known by to HMRC. Additionally HMRC oblige us to advise you that if you pay less Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all your donations in that tax year it is your responsibility to pay any difference.

Members can pay by cash, cheque, bank transfer or monthly standing order (full details are on the form). If any member has difficulty with paying their subscription, please consult with Graham over possible options. We have a reduced rate for those who are unemployed or on a low income. If you owe some subscription fees from last year, add the outstanding amount into the figures on this year's form. Membership cards will be issued on receipt of a completed form – and cash/cheque if paying by that method.

You will also need to keep your copy of 'O Holy Night' from the City Hall concerts on Saturday 16 December, and to bring your 100 Carols for Choirs and a copy of Carols for Choirs Book 1 (for Good King Wenceslas) - and your copy of Messiah. Please bring all the music in your black folder, and wear standard Concert Dress - you might like to wear thermals underneath as it is often extremely cold in the church! There's an unlocked car park near the church that those with cars can use.
