#### **Next rehearsal**

Our next rehearsal is on Tuesday 15 October in the Upper School. There are auditions after the rehearsal so please leave as quickly and as quietly as you can.

This is the final rehearsal before the recording on Monday 21 October (details below) so it is compulsory for anyone wishing to take part in the recording; we will rehearse the Rutter *Gloria* all evening.

#### Rehearsal schedule, notes and practice tracks (attachment)

Chairman Paul Henstridge has updated the rehearsal notes given by Darius, for both the Rutter and the ballroom music (attached). #### Arrangements for the Rutter recording

We will record the Rutter *Gloria* with the Black Dyke Band on Monday 21 October from 7pm to 9pm, in St Peter and St Oswald's Church, 2 Bannerdale Road, Sheffield S7 2DL. The church is on the corner of Abbeydale Road and Bannerdale Road; there is a map on the church website: <u>http://www.st-peter-and-st-oswalds.co.uk/how-to-find-us.php</u>. There's also a rather good virtual tour of the church, so if you're the sort of person who likes to know the set up in advance, do check it out: <u>http://www.st-peter-and-st-oswalds.co.uk/virtual-tour-of-the-church.php</u>

The church will be open from 4pm so that the recording engineers and then the band can set up, but it will be best for them if we don't start to arrive until about 6.15pm. We only have 2 hours to make the recording so please can everyone be in the church for a prompt start at 7pm. We'll be recording from 7pm to 9pm and the band and engineers will be clearing away until around 10pm.

Please note that Sheffield United are playing at home that evening, so there may be traffic holdups; please set off in plenty of time to park up and get in for 7pm. Please swipe in with your membership card in the usual way; we are hoping to be able to set up the bar code reader at the back of the church near the entrance, but be prepared to sign in on paper just in case.

There is a kitchen on the premises but it is very small and will be used by the band and technical staff. It really isn't large enough to enable us to offer refreshments to the choir, so bring your own drinks and snacks if you need them - and please don't be the one to embarrass Helen by trying to persuade her to make an exception for you! The toilet is located next to the kitchen.

The band will store their instrument cases etc in the side chapel, so please keep out of there. Chorus members may leave their belongings either at the back of the church, where there is plenty of space, or in the body of the church where we will be gathering to sing. Details about exactly where we will sing, and whether there will be chairs there or at the sides, won't be decided until the sound engineer has conducted tests and decided where to place us in relation to the band, so please be ready to respond to instructions from our Rehearsals and Events Officer James Oliver on the night.

Please make sure that you turn the pages of your score as quietly as possible during recording, and try not to shuffle around, scrape your chair or make noises other than those indicated in the score. And as always when recording, everyone will need to be absolutely silent immediately before and after singing a section.

Please note that although the church does have a car park, spaces have been reserved for the band vehicles and for people who are gathering that evening for a parish meeting. Chorus members should therefore park their cars on nearby streets rather than in the church car park; members might like to organise car sharing because of the limited space available.

Please enter the church as quietly as you can if you do happen to be late arriving, as recording or at least sound testing is likely to have started and the sound of large hefty church doors creaking or crashing shut isn't going to go down too well!

If taken to an error page it is likely that your computer or laptop has stored the old website in its memory (cache) and you should clear it by pressing REFRESH, or F5 on your PC keyboard. Alternatively it may be that your router needs re-setting; try turning it off for 10 minutes before switching it on again. If none of this works please contact Anne Adams in the first instance, and she will inform the webmasters Matthew Morgan and Bill Best.
