Ticket sales

Ticket sales so far for Messiah = 25.

Our target for Messiah is to sell ALL the available tickets, ie 350. Tickets cost £20 and £5 (under 25s) and were made available online last week, at https://www.wegottickets.com/event/496865. There's a link on the Chorus website and on the Classical Sheffield website. Tickets will be on sale at rehearsals soon; these will not have the 10% booking fee that WeGotTickets are charging. They'll also be available at the Sheffield cathedral shop. All the tickets are unallocated, so it will be first come first served on the night.

Ticket sales so far for the Verdi Requiem = 624.

Choral concerts usually get around 400 people turning up on the night, so the pre-concert sales need to reach about 1,000 to safely reach the target, and more to avoid the concert making a loss for the three partners (Sheffield International Venues, the Halle Concert Society and SPC).

The overall message, for both SICS and self-funded concerts, is that all efforts made by members to help sell tickets are efforts well spent!

Messiah - arrangements so far for the French and German visit

We are expecting 50 visitors from Germany (43 singers and 7 others), and 38 from France (34 singers and 4 others). Some are staying in hotels, but many thanks to everyone who has offered to put those up who prefer to stay with Chorus members – your generosity is much appreciated!

The German visitors are arriving on Wednesday 15th April and the French visitors the day after. The Lord Mayor has kindly offered a trip round the Town Hall on Friday 17th, and there are likely to be trips to Haddon Hall on Thursday 16th and possibly Friday 17th. The *Messiah* tutti rehearsal, concert and party (see below) will take up most of Saturday 18th. The German visitors will depart on Sunday 19th April, while the French embark on evening concerts in Buxton and Malton on 19th and 20th, with a trip to York on 20th; they will fly home on 22nd April. It would be great if members of the Chorus could support the visitors by attending one or both of the two concerts; details will be provided at a later date.

A post-concert party has been organised at the Cutlers Hall immediately after the Messiah concert, attended by the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress, members of the Black Dyke Band, soloists, French and German visitors and their conductors, together with Friends of the Chorus. Cutlers Hall is a magnificent venue with some wonderfully grand spaces, and we are looking forward to hosting a superb party for our visitors. Members of the Chorus are invited to what should be a really good do, tickets £10 to include canapés and the first drink.
