Next rehearsal

Our next rehearsal is on Tuesday 11 February 2020 in the Lower School, when we will be rehearsing the Verdi *Requiem*.

The rehearsal will be in the Sports Hall, Lower School, Darwin Lane, Sheffield, S10 5RG; there's a Google map on this link to <u>the school's website</u>.

On arrival please walk round the building to the right of the entrance and turn left around the high brick wall into to the back entrance, which takes you directly into the Sports Hall. Please leave via the same route at the end.

The Lower School is well used for sports activities which unfortunately makes parking difficult; you may need to park some distance away, so do allow extra time.

For those travelling by bus the 51 service runs along Sandygate Road and it is a 15 minute walk from Crosspool Post Office along Watt Lane and down Darwin Lane to the school gate. The 120 service runs along Fulwood Road and it is a 13 minute uphill walk from Fulwood Road along Tapton Park Road and Darwin Lane to the school gate. Ticket sales

Ticket sales so far for Messiah = 8.

Our target for Messiah is to sell ALL the available tickets, ie 350. Tickets cost £20 and £5 (under 25s) and were made available online last week, at https://www.wegottickets.com/event/496865. There's a link on the Chorus website and on the Classical Sheffield website. We are thinking about printing a number of tickets to sell at rehearsals, in which case there won't be the 10% booking fee that WeGotTickets are charging. They'll also be available at the Sheffield cathedral shop. All the tickets are unallocated, so it will be first come first served on the night.

Ticket sales so far for the Verdi *Requiem* = 623.

Just to remind members that the City Hall's standard target for the Sheffield International Concert Season (SICS) choral concerts is 1,300, which is 57% of the total capacity of 2,270. The target is set lower than the break-even number, ie, at a level which results in an acceptable loss to the three partners that between them underwrite the choral concerts (Sheffield International Venues, the Halle Concert Society and SPC). All three partners have made a loss on all the SICS choral concerts for quite some years. Figures show that choral concerts sell fewer tickets than orchestral concerts. For example, the most popular choral concert in the last five years was the Mozart *Requiem* in 2017, for which ticket sales were 1,259, ie didn't quite reach the target. The two 2019 Christmas concerts sold 1,370 ie 60% (2pm) and 1,084 ie 48% (5.30pm), or 2,454 in total, which is about the same as in previous years. Choral concerts usually get around 400 people turning up on the night, so the pre-concert sales need to reach about 1,000 to safely reach the target, and more to avoid the concert making a loss for the three partners.

The overall message, for both SICS and self-funded concerts, is that all efforts made by members to help sell tickets are efforts well spent!

News about our recording of 'O Holy Night'

A chap called David Carter from the Devon and Cornwall Salvation Army band rang Anne Adams last week, asking for Darius' arrangements of 'O Holy Night', 'Calypso Carol' and 'Hail Smiling Morn', so the Devon and Cornwall band could learn them to perform at a big Christmas concert in 2020. He had bought our 'Awake Arise' CD after hearing 'O Holy Night' on the Classic FM Drive programme shortly before Christmas, and was extremely impressed – he says he played the CD repeatedly over the festive season. You may know that Classical FM listeners voted 'O Holy Night' the nation's favourite carol for the fourth consecutive year. It's won 15 times over the years and they always play the Kings College Cambridge recording. David reported that they played our version of the carol for the first time, which is great news.

Reminder - launch of 2021 Classical Sheffield Festival on Fri 28 February 2020

Classical Sheffield is holding an event to launch the next weekend festival, which will run from Friday 5 to Sunday 7 March 2021 with a theme of 'Collaboration'. SPC has already agreed to take part in the final concert of the weekend, a performance of Mahler's 2nd Symphony at the City Hall on Sunday 7 March, in collaboration with Hallam Choral Society, Hallam Sinfonia and Sheffield Philharmonic Orchestra.

The launch event is on Friday 28 February, 6.00 - 8.00pm at the Montgomery Theatre and is a chance to find out more about the next Classical Weekend and to gather ideas and questions. Also, Theresa Keogh, new director of the Montgomery, will speak about their plans for redeveloping the building, making it fully accessible, and the wide variety of spaces they currently have on offer for groups to use at very reasonable rates. There will also be the opportunity to look around the building.

It would be great for SPC to have a representative or two at the launch, to gather information and meet with other Classical Sheffield members. If you are willing to attend on our behalf, please contact Anne Adams by replying to this weekly update.
