Next rehearsal - update

The committee held a virtual meeting via Zoom last week and agreed that re-commencing live rehearsals in September is looking increasingly unlikely, and that concerts will probably not recommence until January 2021 at the earliest.

Prior to the meeting Darius had arranged for Rachel, Marianne and Anne to attend a Bournemouth Symphony Chorus virtual rehearsal. Despite the limitations, their experience was a positive one, and the committee agreed that setting up something similar for the Chorus would be very worthwhile.

Darius and Rachel are therefore going to look at the possibility of setting up some form of non-mandatory on-line rehearsal, probably using Zoom, aiming for a trial run sometime in June. If it works out, invitations to join the trial will be issued in a future update, so watch this space!

Maggie's 'concerts'

Every Saturday evening Maggie dresses in concert gear and sings the mezzo soprano or alto solo from one of the works in which she had been scheduled to appear prior to the lock-down. She sits during chorus numbers, just as she would in a real performance. A number of members of SPC and the Halle chorus are spending their Saturday evenings in a similar way, singing the chorus numbers to their own recording of the same work. The reason is to keep their voices in good shape and 'concert-ready' – and for fun, a sense of solidarity and shared endeavour. Maggie sang Haydn's *Maria Theresa Mass* last evening, and her remaining Saturday evening 'concerts' are as follows:

May 16 - Verdi *Requiem;* June 6 - Rossini *Petite Messe Solonnelle*; June 13 - Brahms *Alto Rhapsody*; June 20 - Rutter *Feel the Spirit*; June 27 - Elgar *Dream of Gerontius*; July 4 - Mahler *Symphony No. 8*.

Music in the Round free online festival 15 and 16 May 2020

Music in the Round will present their first ever free online festival of music this May. Schaffield Chamber Music Festival at home (#SCMFhome) will feature more than a dozen performances, talks and family events, all launching on the Music in the Round YouTube channel over two days on Friday 15 and Saturday 16 May. The online schedule will feature solos and duos from many of the Ensemble 360 musicians and guest artists, eg international guitarist Craig Ogden, Mercury Music Prize-nominee Gavin Bryars, and acclaimed folk musicians Fay Hield and Rob Harbron.

Families can watch one of Music in the Round's acclaimed concerts for children aged 3-7 years, the recording of Sir Scallywag and the Battle of Stinky Bottom, originally live-streamed to Sheffield Children's Hospital in November last year, and publicly available for the first

time. There will also be a specially-created Concerteenies event featuring violinist Benjamin Nabarro and cellist Gemma Rosefield, for younger children aged 3 and under.
