On-line singing sessions for children

You may remember Tom Leech, who has taken rehearsals in lieu of Darius now and again. Tom is Director of the Schools Singing Programme in the Diocese of Leeds, has set up daily virtual singing sessions as YouTube videos. Aimed at primary children the sessions are led by expert choral directors, and combine warm-ups, vocal exercises and lots of sacred and secular songs, together with plenty of music learning and RE linked to some of the music. 1. Keep enjoying music (updated)

We all know how good just listening to music is for the soul. So much music already exists online and through national and local broadcasts, and lots more is being added.

- St John's Passion from Isolation a wonderfully moving version of Bach's magnificent work by Oxford Bach Soloists and guests, with production company Positive Note in aid of Help Musicians UK (donations invited). It is being recorded by each player and singer in their own home and released in 9 episodes, the first of which was launched on YouTube on 10 April. Featuring Daniel Norman as the Evangelist, Roderick Williams as Jesus, a range of soloists include Catherine Wyn-Rogers and James Gilchrist, with contributions from the Kings Singers and The Sixteen among others, it is well worth a listen. The <u>digital programme</u> has links to a list of participants and to the different episodes; there's even a chorale booklet to enable listeners to join in.
