Our next rehearsal will be on Tuesday 2 November, at King Edwards Upper School at 7pm. Please enter via the gates from Glossop Road, whether by car or on foot. You can leave via either gate, but please note that they open inwards!

If someone is dropping you off please can they do so either before entering the drive, without blocking the entrance, or by driving right into the car park and then turning round, otherwise you could cause quite a blockage. The school was instructed to install these gates by Ofsted, and there will obviously be a period of adjustment as everyone gets used to them and how they work. Sadly KES has made a complaint about the rudeness of one of our members following a blockage on the drive a few weeks ago. They also reported rudeness from another member entering on foot on the same night. We have apologised profusely for both of these unfortunate incidents.

Tuesday evening is the final rehearsal of the After Hours music (brown envelopes), and it is our practice for those who are not taking part in the concert to stay at home for that rehearsal. If you can't bear to be away, that's fine, but please don't sing, as Darius needs to hear what it will sound like the following night, at the concert itself.

Do join us after rehearsal at the Francis Newton pub nearby – everyone is welcome, especially new folk. Take your car with you though - the gates are locked after we leave the premises!

She will give them out to members on Tuesday evening, on a 'first come first served' basis. Anne has also negotiated the pre-printing of After Hours tickets so that audience members can be handed them quickly on the night. The audience will be capped at 300.

Arrangements for the After Hours concert on Wednesday 3 November 2021

The concert is next Wednesday 3 November, at 9.15pm in the City Hall ballroom. There will be a pre-concert run-through from 5.45 to 6.30pm. Though not compulsory, please try your best to attend this rehearsal, which will be our last chance to get the music sounding wonderful! Please

try to arrive around 5.30 and be ready to follow instructions about where to stand – we need to be as spread out as possible, using both the stage and the floor in front of it.

You will be able to get into the City Hall from around 5pm, using the Stage Door entrance which is round the back, on the right as you look at the hall, down a short flight of steps. There's a bell on the right if the door is locked. Please make your way to the ballroom as quickly as you can, so that there is no crowding on the corridors on that floor, and we don't get in the way of the Halle players. Turn left as soon as you enter the stage door and walk all the way along, through three sets of double doors, until you reach the stairs. The ballroom is in the basement right at the bottom. There's a lift for those who need it; ask at the Stage Door.

Dressing rooms will be in the North and South Halls, on each side of the ballroom, ladies one side, gentlemen the other. You can leave your bags there but don't leave valuables as the rooms won't be locked. Those bringing a packed tea can eat in the dressing rooms, but please use the bins provided and leave the room as we find it.

Please make sure you sign in – the table(s) will be set out in the basement corridor. Please note that new rules issued to venues following the Manchester bombing mean that **everyone must sign out each time they leave the backstage area, and back in again on re-entry**. Please try your best not to linger too long round the signing-in table(s).

Please gather in the dressing rooms ready to line up at 9pm - those attending the Halle concert get down as soon as you can! Darius will announce the running order at the rehearsal.

Please bring your black Chorus folders, and come in full concert dress. Please follow the guidelines carefully – it would be a tragedy if you were not allowed to sing on the night! See Members Area / Concert arrangements / Stage Procedure and Concert Dress

Please take your usual sensible approach to reduce the risk of Covid-19 infection, or accidents:

- do not attend if you have C-19 symptoms or have been exposed to an infected person
- wear a face covering when not singing
- use the hand sanitisers provided, and don't share music etc
- stay distanced as much as you can, especially on narrow corridors
- bring your own drinks and don't share them
- don't use breakable vessels in dressing rooms
- · store and carry hot drinks safely
- no drinks on stage during the performance
- keep belongings out of thoroughfares, especially in restricted areas
- take care when using the stairs and steps to the stage
- make sure you know the emergency evacuation procedure (below)

In the event of an emergency, a continuous alarm will be sounded and we will be directed out to either the war memorial on Barker's Pool (fire), or to Devonshire Green (bomb alert). Follow the directions of marshals and leave in an orderly fashion. Do not try to retrieve belongings.
