Reminder - French trip

SPC is planning a mini-tour to Perigueux in France, from Wed 10 to Wed 17 July. This is an official mini-tour, so Darius would come with us and conduct the concerts we do on our own. However, it's not compulsory. We are going ahead with this tour – as long as we can involve sufficient members for it to be a balanced choir.

There would be one or possibly two joint performances of Faure's *Requiem* with the French choirs in a cathedral in Perigueux, with a piece by Theodore Dubois and a new work by Ensemble Vocale de Perigueux's new MD <u>Bruno Rossignol</u>. SPC would do a couple of concerts on our own, in local churches, including an organ recital by Darius. Rehearsals would be at KES after the last concert of the season – these dates allow time for three full rehearsals.

French hosts, some of which speak English, are happy to provide accommodation and meals for those members who'd like to stay at someone's home. This does reduce the cost and the French hosts are extremely welcoming, but you could stay in local hotels if you prefer or if you'd like to be accompanied by a friend or family member. Last time a couple of people went in motor homes or stayed on a local campsite. Travel can be by train or aeroplane, or of course in your own vehicle. There would probably be an evening social with the French choirs, and a bit of time for sight-seeing.
