The rehearsal will be in the Sports Hall in the Lower School, Darwin Lane, Sheffield, S10 5RG; there's a Google map on the school's website. Please walk round the right side of the building and turn left around the high brick wall to get to the back entrance, which takes you directly into the Sports Hall. Please leave via the same route at the end.

The Lower School is well used for sports activities which unfortunately makes parking difficult; you may need to park some distance away, so do allow extra time. For those travelling by bus check out the 51 and the 120 services. See the Travel South Yorkshire website.

Mahler 2 concert

Many thanks to everyone who sang or bought tickets for last night's wonderful Mahler 2 concert. Thanks to alto Kathy Towers for providing those lovely words for us to sing. Congratulations to Rachel Fright – what a pleasure to see her on stage accepting her Young Composer Competition award! Thank you, Rachel, for accompanying us superbly in rehearsals, as always. And a very big thank you to Darius for conducting and for preparing us so well, both for the Mahler and for the two competition pieces. Grateful thanks to everyone who helped with the organisation, it was a super night!

The concert on Sunday was sold out, 1392 tickets (balcony blocked off - it can't be opened without notice as it takes five extra staff to operate safely). There's no question that it went well – the audience loved it (almost?) as much as the performers. Final finances have yet to be worked out, but it looks as though the fund-raising, Gustav Mahler Society donation plus ticket income has covered all the costs – and might be able to pay the full travel costs for Anna Harvey, who flew from Dusseldorf on Saturday afternoon after her Magic Flute rehearsal in the morning, and Ella Taylor, who came up on an early train from London after her ENO performance on Saturday night. Both enjoyed it enormously and were a delight to listen to.

The festival was very successful, reaching over 7,000 audience at concerts totalling 42 hours of music with 1,000 performers in 8 venues. The sponsors who were there (Victoria Wood and Foyle Foundation) were very impressed, as were the four city region mayors – or 'the chain gang' as the Lord Mayor of Sheffield says they call themselves! The competition winners really

enjoyed it, as did their families, and were thrilled with the beautiful trophies – and to hear that SPC has given them back the copyright for their works, and had the competition filmed for their portfolios.
