Update re Mahler 2 in Monte Carlo in September

A sign-up list will be available at the next couple of rehearsals, for folk to sign up for the trip – see Administrator Anne Adams on Tuesday. The sign-up list will also ask whether you will want to travel by coach to and from Birmingham, cost to be shared by those using the coach.

Anne has written to CBSO asking whether people who prefer to travel by car or train can be accommodated and will report via the update when CBSO reply. Here are answers to some questions asked last week:

- The £330 covers both air fare and accommodation (an extremely good deal).
- Implication of the twin room booking is that members will need to pair up.
- Family members cannot be accommodated via the CBSO arrangement.
- Volunteers MUST have sung the Mahler 2 in March CBSO specifically asked for singers who had performed it very recently.
- The performance won't be off copy but singers will be expected to know the piece well.
- There won't be any rehearsals other than those on Saturday 23 in Monte Carlo.

A gentle reminder that we will have started rehearsals for our October concert, so CBSO will not be asked about extensions beyond 22nd to 25th September - Darius responded positively to the request because the trip would not interrupt SPC rehearsals.

Men - to DJ or not to DJ? What do you think?

SPC Committee supports a change to the concert dress code for tenors and basses. Owning a DJ can be a significant cost and is seen as a barrier for new members joining the choir, whereas a simple black suit can be bought much more cheaply. The new proposal is to wear either (a) black trousers, black shirt and no tie or jacket or (b) black trousers, black jacket and white shirt with no tie, depending on the occasion (eg jackets at City Hall).
