Members who can't attend will need permission to sing in the concert; arrangements for the concert are listed below. **Rehearsal notes from last Tue 17 October** are attached. It would really help Darius at the piano rehearsal on 24 October if everyone could ensure that their scores include all of these notes.

King Edward's School has given us permission to use their car park but remember that the car must be removed before 9.15, when the gates will lock automatically. There is usually some street parking near St Mark's; it's free from 6pm. available to buy on the door on the night of the concert, not just those for children and carers, payment by card or cash.

Arrangements for the concert on Saturday 28 October 2023 (pdf version attached)

Please help on the day if you can, either with set-up before the rehearsal (see Jim Monach) refreshments (see Helen Kirk) or front of house (see Anne Adams)

- Saturday 28 October 2024 at 19.30 in St Mark's Church Broomhill.
- There's a compulsory pre-concert rehearsal on Saturday from 14.30 to 17.00 (maybe earlier), also in the Church.
- Soloist, instrumentalists and MD have reserved spaces at St Mark's and there will be space for Blue Badge holders and others with mobility issues - but please inform Jim Monach <u>JimMonach@sheffieldphil.org</u> so a space can be reserved for you.
- King Edward's have said we can use the school car park for the afternoon and evening of
 the concert. This arrangement is for Chorus members only, so please don't advertise it. The
 Glossop Road gates should open and close on approach just as they do on Tuesdays.
- On the day you should be able to get into the Church from around 13.30. Once inside sign in at the desk using your membership card, or on the sheet available
- We will sit in the chancel on the chairs provided. These may still be being organised because of last-minute apologies and the fact that it's an awkward space, so please be patient, alert for instructions and prepared to move if asked.
- Your place at the rehearsal on the day will be your place at the concert.
- **Please be in your place by 14.20**. We'll be doing the unaccompanied pieces first, then *Quam Dilecta*, then the Durufle followed by the Tavener.
- The soloist and instrumentalists will continue to rehearse when we finish, so please leave quickly and quietly.
- There is a single dressing room upstairs, ie NO SEPARATE FACILITIES FOR LADIES AND GENTS; the stairs will be pointed out to you. It will be rather cramped, so you may prefer to arrive already in concert dress. You may leave bags in the dressing room but it won't be locked.
- There are toilets upstairs, as well as at the back of the church, where there is a disabled toilet. However this may be used as a dressing room so avoid unless you really need it.
- Use the dressing room and the church to wait and to eat and drink if not going home or out for tea. Please leave these spaces clean and tidy.
- Please don't disturb Darius, Maggie, Simon or Neil in their dressing rooms as they use these as a place of calm and preparation, not just for changing.
- The concert programme will be a simple sheet which we will provide free of charge. It won't include notes about the works, as Darius will introduce the pieces.
- We will enter the performance area without lining up. Just take your places informally and gradually. Please be in your seat by 19.20 at the latest.
- During the 20-minute interval refreshments will be served in the lounge at the back of the church (donations). Please be back in your seat in plenty of time.
- Music in black folders please and be careful not to turn pages over at the end of a
 movement; stay engaged and looking at the conductor until the next one starts. Turn the
 page early if we have a rapid entry and turn pages quietly at all times.
- Full concert dress please check that you have appropriate gear, especially if you are new – it would be a tragedy if you were unable to sing on the day! See <u>Members Area / Arrangements for concerts / stage procedure and dress code</u> for details.
 - Gentlemen in black shirts (no shiny material, black buttons), black trousers, black socks, and black shoes, with a black jacket or DJ if you feel cold.

- Ladies take particular care about shoes, style etc concert dress is classic rather than fashion or niche and there shouldn't be anything fancy! <u>Members Area /</u> Arrangements for concerts / stage procedure and dress code.
- Stand when the conductor walks on, holding closed folder in your right arm held at your side; hold it like this whenever we're not singing. Don't clap soloist, instrumentalists or conductor until they come back on for their second bow.
- Health and safety for the concert:
 - o Do not attend if you have symptoms of Covid, flu or a cold
 - o Don't use breakable vessels in the dressing room; store and carry hot drinks safely
 - No drinks on stage during the performance
 - o Keep belongings out of thoroughfares, especially in restricted areas
 - Take care when using stairs and steps
 - In the event of an emergency, leave via the nearest exit either the door to the left of the chancel as you face the front or the main door where you came in. Follow any directions we are given and leave in an orderly fashion. Do not try to retrieve belongings. Gather in the car park or in the nearby street.

Rehearsals after the Durufle concert

Darius will not be issuing a rehearsal schedule for this term, as it is a simple case of rehearsing for the event that follows. So, rehearsals are:

- 31 Oct, 7 and 14 November for the recording session with Black Dyke Band on Monday 20 November please note that all three are compulsory.
- 21 and 28 November and 5 and 12 December for the Christmas carol concert.
