BBC Recording of our Mozart preparations

BBC Radio 4 are planning another run of the Radio 4 music series <u>How to Play</u> programmes later this year, and they'd like to feature SPC in one of the new episodes, focusing on our preparations for Mozart's *Requiem* on 22nd June 2024. The series is scheduled for around the end of August/beginning of September. Darius and the orchestra and conductor have agreed so the project is going ahead.

The BBC will record the 4 June rehearsal in Birkdale School, and the one in Cadogan Hall on 21 June. They will also record interviews with the conductor and a selection of choir members, soloists and orchestral players. The aim is to capture the spoken words of the conductor/music director as they run the session and shape the performance and use those clips plus the interviews to give listeners a fascinating insight into the rehearsal process and how it works. There won't be a broadcast of the complete performance so our fee will only be a few hundred pounds.
