There'll be a short rehearsal, for those singing at St Luke's, after the main rehearsal, **so please put chairs away and leave the hall as quickly and quietly as possible**. Carol singers please collect the music from the Librarians on your way in so you can start promptly at 9pm - Darius will finish 5 mins early to enable this. Many thanks to bass Peter Verity for acting as rehearsal accompanist!

First Nowell, Hail Smiling Morn, Sheffield Carols (Egypt/Tyre Mill), Christmas Eve Barnsley, Winter wonderland (J Cullen), Hark! The herald, O Holy Night (DB) Possible encore: We Wish You a Merry Christmas (in Carols for Choirs but with band intro and accompaniment)
- Full running order: you can download it from this link <u>Christmas 2024 Running Order</u>
- Parking in town: There's a 35% discount at the QPark on Rockingham Street if booked in advance online, see https://www.sheffieldcityhall.co.uk/Q-Park-Rockingham-Street
- Entry and initial registration: Enter via the main front doors, sign in on the sheets provided. These will be transferred to the stage door for sign-outs after the initial entry, so if you arrive late please enter and sign in via the Stage Door (down the steps at the back of the hall). Wrist bands will be supplied, please wear until after the concert. Instruction for how to get to the dressing rooms are lower down this page. Be on the look-out for newer members who look lost.
- Concert programmes: at last, at our repeated request, City Hall will sell programmes to Chorus members in the foyer as we sign in. Price £3, cash only. This is a trial and if it goes well will happen at each concert but only if sales to Chorus members are good and people give the correct change. So it's now up to us!
- On-the-day rehearsal: 12.00 to 13.30. Please be in your seats by 11.50. Follow the seating plan and/or instructions re voice parts, with tall people behind and to the edges. Your seat at rehearsal is your seat for the concert so make a note! NB Remember the very dry acoustic and sing out and with confidence even though it may sound as though you're the only one doing so. Above all look up as much as possible heads in copies looks and sounds unprofessional and is not what we want folk to remember about us.
- Concert start time: 14.30
- Entry onto and off stage: Drift on in your own time, making sure you are in your seat by 14.25 at the very latest. File off AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE at the interval, leading off from the back row first with people from organ seats intermingling. Please be as quick as you can so the people who are the last to leave have time for sherry and mince pies in what is only a 20 minutes interval! Alternatively stay in your seat, as you prefer.
- Interval sherry and mince pies: These will be served along the full length of the production corridor, so please move to the farthest table if you were seated in the upper risers or on the organ seats so those behind you can get to the nearer table of goodies.
- Second half: Please be back for the second half 5 minutes before it starts.
- **Seating plan** Click here to download the plan: TO BE ADDED A few copies will be available on the day; please print your own copy if you can, and take careful note of the seating. If there are last-minute changes please follow verbal instructions.
- **Signing out and back in** Please sign out AT STAGE DOOR if you leave after rehearsal, and back in again on return, on the choir sheets NOT City Hall sheets.
- Dress code for men is black shirts and trousers, plus Christmassy bow tie (eg red or green or both or one that lights up if you like switch on after the interval). Wear a black jacket if you think you'll be cold. Women long sleeved black tops and formal long skirts or trousers as usual NO SASHES. Christmassy ear-rings or necklaces (eg red or green or both, or ones that light up if you prefer -switch on after the interval). Further details at Stage Procedure and Dress Code.

- **Toilets** on the ground floor, ie Stage Door level. or through the doors nearest the dressing rooms into the auditorium; best not to use these during the interval due to the queues!
- Disabled toilet on corridor beyond the VIP dressing rooms (just before the alto/bass stairs), or in DR4.
- Dressing rooms: Ladies in Vincent Harris Suite and Dressing Room 3. Men in Barbirolli Suite.
- Vincent Harris suite (ladies): up the stairs nearest to the Stage Door, then up the next flight and on the corridor at the top. Despite the extra space in DR 3 (ask at Stage door for directions to this room) it will be extremely cramped so please arrive at the City Hall in concert dress at least partly.
- Barbirolli suite (men): through the double doors just past the Stage Door stairs and carry straight
 on through another set of double doors, up the stairs on the right, AND the next flight up, and onto
 the corridor at the top. A longer walk from the Stage Door and very cramped, please come already in
 concert dress if you can.
- Dressings room wheelchair, limited mobility and Xmas lights controllers DR 4 up the stairs nearest the top of the basement staircase; follow signs or ask at the Stage Door. Note that the stair climber will be used on the stairs to this dressing room, be mindful and stay clear when it's being used either wait or use the other stairs and cross in front of the organ.
- Getting on stage altos and basses go up the stairs nearest the top of the basement staircase.
 Sopranos and tenors use the stairs nearest the Stage Door. If your mobility is not what you'd like it to be, use whichever stairs are most convenient at the time and cross to the other side in front of the organ.
- While on stage please look after your water bottle during the rehearsal. Someone has dropped their bottle under the risers at FOUR concert rehearsals now and it's really difficult for the City Hall staff to crawl under the encased scaffolding to retrieve them.
- No after-shave or perfume to avoid breathing problems for others, especially those with allergies.
- Music in SPC black folders please. Use thin black elastic wound round the spine to hold any
 over-sized sheet music it can't be seen from the audience and is kinder to the copies than the
 in-built strings.
- Stage etiquette Be in your seat by 14.25. If you're seated near the stage entrance, please keep an eye on the doors and make sure they are closed with the heavy curtain drawn shut to keep out backstage noise it really does make a significant difference.
 - Darius and the Committee are keen that the Chorus sticks to the agreed procedures better than we have in recent concerts. We will be judged alongside the Band who always observe their approach so precisely. Jim and Anne will take the opportunity at rehearsal to answer any questions members have about what is expected. Our audience do note and comment on these things! So here's the platform procedure:
 - Stand when Darius enters, opening folders once standing as we will sing without introduction.
 - Keep still once the final piece in each half ends, scores still open.
 - When applause starts close folders 'as one', tucking them under right arm with arm down at your side.
 - Do not applaud while standing we are being applauded along with the other performers.
 - Sit down as one when the conductor leaves the stage

- File out as quickly as you can from back row, intermingling with people in the organ seats, moving as quickly as possible down the stairs and along corridors so you don't cause a blockage.
- Packed meal, refreshments: Packed meals are okay, eat in the dressing rooms or balcony, move
 when audience start to arrive and remove any rubbish.
- Pre-concert talk: there isn't one
- Health and safety information:
 - Do not attend if you have symptoms of Covid, flu, a heavy cold or uncontrollable cough
 - Please take your own drinks but don't take them on stage during the concert
 - Don't use breakable vessels; store and carry hot drinks safely
 - Keep belongings out of thoroughfares, especially in restricted areas
 - Take care when using stairs and steps
 - Please stick to the prescribed areas so that we don't compromise the City Hall's safety arrangements. Most importantly, stay away from the basement please!

Evacuation instructions

• In the event of an emergency, a continuous alarm will be sounded, and we will be directed out to the war memorial on Barker's Pool (fire) or to Devonshire Green (bomb). Follow the directions of marshals and leave in an orderly fashion. Do not try to retrieve belongings.
