"Thank you for signing up to sing at Peter's funeral.

• Date, time, venue: 2 pm Monday 10th March, Hathersage Church, rehearsal/warm up 1pm

- We can use the Bell Room by the church from 1 pm. There is a door opposite straight into the church where we will be seated (very tightly!) in the Lady Chapel. We could have a seating trial and warm up/run through in the church but be out again by 1.30, or stay quietly in our seats, as congregation may arrive early.
- There is one hymn, Praise My Soul the King of Heaven and the words will be on the order of service.
- We will sing the Rachmaninov Number 6 Bogoroditse after a moment of quiet reflection during the service. We won't leave our places, and I think sight lines will be very tricky, so we will have to listen very carefully to each other, as I suspect only those near the front will see conductor Rachel.
- The family have included us in an invitation to tea in the Memorial Hall by the swimming pool from 3 pm, after the burial (family and close friends only). **However you must let them know if you plan to come by emailing** <u>hannahmileswatson@gmail.com</u>. This is Hannah, one of Peter's 3 daughters.
