Chorus organisation - please volunteer for the vacant positions if you can

Thank you to the members who have volunteered for vacant positions – we are gradually getting there! A number of important positions still need to be filled. The list below provides links to the relevant page about the role on our Chorus website, so please have a look and see if you can offer your services to help run and develop the Chorus. You will receive lots of help from committee members and in the case of the Secretary role, from Anne Adams. The committee meets around six times a year and meetings are enjoyable and never boring!

- <u>Secretary</u> now a very much-reduced role from that undertaken by Anne and previous role holders, as many responsibilities and tasks have been allocated to other roles. In addition, Anne will have completed the rehearsal set-up and AGM tasks, so the role will be more modest in the first year of taking over.
- Member Reps members of the Chorus get four places on the committee, duration
 three years (though can be shorter of course). It's the members direct line into the
 running of the Chorus and two of our three current reps are due to stand down in
 October, resulting in THREE vacances. Attendance at committee meetings and liaison
 with members are the only responsibilities.

Though not committee roles, we also need a <u>Tenor Voice Rep</u> – NOT the same as Member Rep of the committee, and there's no need to attend meetings, it's more about checking the attendance and general wellbeing of members. Come on tenors!

Jim Monach's memorial service

Thank you to all those who took part in Jim's memorial service in the Upper Chapel. The service was beautiful, though emotional, and Darius and the Chorus did him proud. Our President Rachel Copley gave a lovely tribute which is reproduced below.

"Being a long-standing member of the Sheffield Phil, there are a number of personalities that stand out in the memory during those years, and Jim's is most certainly one of them. As a stalwart member of the tenor section, his enthusiasm was infectious. As a soprano I was, and am, often seated near the tenors, and in Jim's eyeline in places like King Edward's School where we used to rehearse, and the odd 'quirky glance' was exchanged when things didn't quite go according to plan!

On a practical level Jim helped in setting up rehearsal rooms, moving pianos, erecting and storing music stands and organising seating, which inevitably meant that he was there early and left late. Before concert days we are sent an email with colour coded seating for our positions on the platform, and Jim was in charge of getting us to sit with sight lines to the conductor, filling any gaps, shorter folk at the front etc, duties which he performed briskly, and sometimes brusquely, on concert days.

The singers here today received a very comprehensive email, detailing timings for the rehearsal and where the various voice parts should sit. Half way down in these instructions was the following, which I loved: 'There is no seating plan (sorry Jim!)'

The choice of music for today encompasses the spirit of Jim, I think, with the lyrical tenor line to the Faure, the emotion of the Rachmaninov and the joyfulness of the Rutter and the traditional Sheffield pub carol.

Living as I do near Doncaster and allowing for the vagaries of Sheffield traffic, I sometimes arrive at rehearsals well before they start, and over the years, with one or two family or health crises going on, Jim was always there with a comforting or caring word, maybe a hug or a merry quip, as I suspect he also was for many members.

Jim was not simply a member of a choir, but one of the 'Phil family' and that family will miss him hugely."
